




SYMBOLS OF ROKAR

AURONN TRIVAR SAI OZNAR



Name: The Eternal Halo - AURONN

Core meaning: The Eternal, memory, continuity, the promise that Rokar outlasts fear.

The inner ring is the self, the outer ring is the world, the rays are the will that radiates outward.

The two rings also echo the two moons, not as literal moons, but as “inner truth” and “outer responsibility.”



Name: The Moon Gate Sigil - TRIVAR

Core meaning: Passage, alignment, sacred geometry, travel between worlds, especially when Nruni and Ecosh form the convergence.

The triangle is the alignment frame, the crescent is the “caught moon,” meaning the moment is held, stabilized, and made usable.

The crescent can also be interpreted as Nruni, and the triangle’s three points as Rokar, Nruni, Ecosh, the convergence that makes impossible travel briefly possible.




Name: Latfa Flame - SAI

Core meaning: Life force, courage, purification, the inner fire that does not become rage.

It is a single flame with a calm, controlled curve, not a wild blaze. It signals trained power.

Also, in Rokar culture, uncontrolled flame equals Vu'unu's path, controlled flame equals protector discipline. Same element, different soul.



Name: The Red Mountain Covenant - OZNAR

Core meaning: The mountains that forge destiny, the oath of protection, and the doctrine “peace has a price.”

A mountain frame, with an inner rising path, suggesting ascent through discipline, and the hidden seam of the world beneath the sands.

The interior diagonal can also be read as the “safe line,” a precursor to later battlefield markings like Guide Marks, but older, more sacred.
